Dear Sir

As you will no doubt know, this morning at approximately 9.00am a former member of our film unit, Avraham Yisraeli, forced his way into my car at the Dimon Inn and during the course of the journey up to the Hotel Zefat, he threatened with physical violence both myself and my driver, Yacov Farjon.

We stopped by a police car and told the officers what was taking place and we all then proceeded to your police station where this said man, in the presence of your officers, continued to threaten me and the film that we are producing here.

As you may know, this man has recently been involved in an accident and he has a most excitable and possibly dangerous character and I consider his threats to me, my personnel and my film to be very serious indeed, and I would be obliged if you would take whatever steps necessary and within your power to see to it that this man is forced to restrain himself. As he has threatened to disrupt our work we must request that a police officer be placed on duty with the unit for the rest of our filming here, which will finish this coming weekend, so that, should this man appear he can be removed.

As you know, this is not the first complaint I have had to make with respect to violence and threats of violence while we have been in your city and I have brought the matter to the attention of the Film Centre of the Ministry of Commerce & Industry and the Chief of Police in ~~Jerusalem~~, to whom I am sending a copy of this letter.
